In 1712, the Kangxi Emperor published an unprecedented book of poems with woodblock illustrations of thirty-six views in his newly completed summer palace. These poetic visions summarized his lifelong goal to redefine imperial sovereignty. Kangxi also ordered the translation of the woodblock images into European copperplate engravings. By combining Manchu and Han as well as Chinese and Western elements, Kangxi's Thirty-six Views project exemplified the multi-cultural hybridity of Qing culture during an earlier phase of imperialism and globalization.
