## Written Qualifying Exams

Once all language and course requirements are satisfied and your committee has been approved, the qualifying examinations may be taken. **All examinations must be completed within a four-week period.** With the consent of the department, the examinations may be repeated only once.

Students in Chinese Literature and Culture must take: (1) a general examination in Chinese literature; (2) examinations in two approved fields which must be chosen from at least two of the following groups: (a) Chinese poetry, Chinese fiction and drama, and modern Chinese literature; (b) ancient Chinese civilization, Chinese Buddhism, another field of Chinese thought or Chinese linguistics; (c) an outside field from within the department; or (d) a field offered in another department or interdepartmental program.
