Written Qualifying Exams

Once all language and course requirements are satisfied and your committee has been approved, the qualifying examinations may be taken. **All examinations must be completed within a four-week period.** With the consent of the department, the examinations may be repeated only once.

Students in Korean Language & Culture must take (1) a general examination in Korean literature; (2) examinations in three approved fields which must be chosen from at least two of the following groups: (a) Korean poetry, Korean fiction, modern Korean literature; (b) Korean Buddhism, Korean thought, or Korean linguistics; (c) an outside field from within the department; or (d) a field offered in another department or interdepartmental program.
